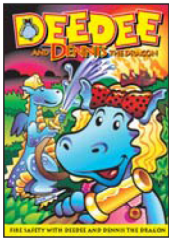

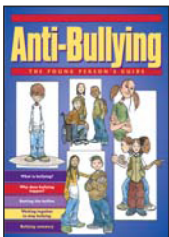
For 6-7 year olds

Accident Prevention - Play Safe, Stay Safe, Keep Safe

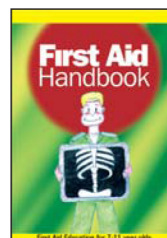

Drugs Education - Will Power's Beware

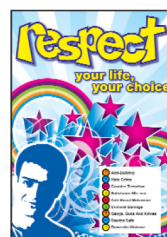

World Report on Child Injury Prevention 2008

Every day around the world the lives of more than 2,000 families are torn apart by the loss of a child to an unintentional injury or so-called 'accident' that could have been prevented. Children from disadvantaged backgrounds are:

- 13 times more likely to die in accidents overall.
- 21 times more likely to die as pedestrians on the roads.
- 38 times as likely to die in a house fire.

In A&E visits and emergency admissions, childhood accidents cost the NHS over £375m per year. Subsequent treatment, which can last a lifetime, costs £millions more.
